Adolescent Mental Health and Substance Abuse Treatment

The Abraxas Counseling Center, located just outside of downtown Cleveland on the RTA bus line, serves male and female youth, ages 12 – 18. The Center provides treatment services for youth with mental health, substance abuse, behavioral disorders and sexual offending behaviors. Our treatment approach is designed to address the holistic needs of our clients by offering gender-specific treatment, individual and group sessions, and family counseling, as well as case management services and random drug screens.

Every client is assessed prior to admission in an effort to determine the most appropriate services to meet his or her needs. The Center is easily accessible to public transportation and incurs the cost of each client's travel expenses.

SERVICE TRACKS

- Substance Abuse Treatment: Alcohol and other drug assessments, outpatient & intensive outpatient, family counseling, case management and random drug screens
- Mental Health Services: Including mental health assessments, anger management, abuse/trauma-informed counseling, depression, anxiety, symptom management, case management, problematic behavior identification and modification, pro-social activity linkage
- Co-occurring Mental Health & Substance Abuse Disorders: Individual and family counseling services to provide comprehensive, integrated care and community support services including case management, community psychiatric support and treatment, advocacy and collaboration with court and school, communication and organization skills, job readiness, pro-social engagement
- Juvenile Sex Offender Assessment & Treatment: Individual, family, and group counseling services that address factors contributing to decisions to engage in sexually inappropriate behavior. Resources and interventions used are based upon current standards in the field of JSO treatment and assessment. Services are comprehensive with goal of not only addressing



risk factors, but increasing protective factors that would assist in reducing likelihood of sexual and non-sexual recidivism. Our assessment of adolescents who engage in abusive sexual behavior are multidimensional, combining multiple sources of information including interviews/observations, record review, self-report and parent-report using the best evidence-based strategies, evaluation and risk assessment instruments available.

• In-home Family Therapy*: Uses Integrative Family and Systems Treatment Model (I-FAST); Family inclusion is at the core of our treatment philosophy. Focus is on identifying behavior patterns in families and developing strategies and family skills to change these patterns and problem behaviors.

- Weekly case management & drug screens

Evidence-Based/Evidence-Informed Curricula: Our evidence-based curricula serve as the basis for our various treatment programs but we recognize the diversity in needs of our clients and utilize supplemental resources to assist in meeting those needs.

Trauma Outcome Process

- Support youth in developing an awareness of how they came to commit acts of violence and sexual aggression and how they can choose to address such behavior
- Utilizes a life course perspective based upon theories of human and family ecology

- Strength-based methods to develop healthy lifestyles
